



The Oklahoma Institute for Learning Styles is seeking Education majors for \$10,000.00 per year scholarships!

The Oklahoma Institute for Learning Styles at Northeastern State University has applied to the Department of Education for funding for our third class of Native Scholars. The US Department of Education will make their announcement of awards on or around May 18, 2007. This date will follow the end of our Spring semester. In order to interview and award scholarships for the Fall '07 semester we are asking eligible students to submit an "intent to apply" form. This form must be received by our office by May 31, 2007.

We are beginning our recruitment process to award 20 scholarships for Fall, 2007 semester. Those selected for award will receive a maximum of \$10,000.00 per year for three years. The goal of the Native Scholars Program at Northeastern is to increase the number of native teachers in schools with high Indian populations. Those making application to the scholarship program must meet NSU College of Education admission requirements, including:

- Follow a course of study that will result in teacher certification.
- Having completed 60 hours of college credit by the end of Spring '07.
- Hold a 2.5 overall GPA.
- Be an enrolled member of a federally recognized tribal group.
- Graduate on or before August, 2010.
- Be enrolled as a full time student.
- Agree to teach in a high Native population school.
