Dr. Denny, a native of Stigler, worked at Oklahoma State Penitentiary in McAlester for 15 years. He also is a CLEET-certified reserve law enforcement officer and serves as chaplain for our own campus police department. While teaching at East Central University, Dr. Denny was president of the Oklahoma Criminal Justice Association and had a distinguished military career. He commanded three military police commands in the U.S. Army Reserve and Oklahoma National Guard and retired as a major in the Army Reserve. He deployed one of his units to support Operation Joint Endeavor units in Bosnia. As commander of another unit, he was a platoon leader during Operation Desert Storm and received the Meritorious Service Medal. He also provided security by 5 p.m. the day of the bombing of the Alfred P. Murrah Building in Oklahoma City in 1995 and commanded a special deployment to Panama, Central America. He was activated in 2003 to train security troops for Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom following the terrorist attacks against the United States on Sept. 11, 2001. Since his retirement from ECU, Dr. Denny is a licensed minister who evangelizes around the country.
