

The department's magazine, Trailblazer, received the Grand Award in the Publication (Small Team) category and an Achievement Award for Most Improved Design. Additionally, the team was presented with an Excellence Award in the Promotional or Feature Photo (Small Team) category for "Song from the Heart," an evocative photograph of EOSC student Melanie Richard participating in the Eastern's Got Talent event during Homecoming Week 2024. Trailblazer also garnered an Honorable Mention in the Magazine (Print or Digital) category.

"I am so proud of and thankful for this team," said Jacob Sitton, EOSC Director of Marketing and Communications. "We had to overcome a lot of hurdles this past year, including building a magazine from scratch. Everything we do in this department is truly a team effort. None of us could have accomplished any of this on our own."

The OCPRA Awards Competition is an annual event to honor outstanding achievements in communications among Oklahoma's public and private higher education institutions. It aims to recognize excellence and foster healthy competition among professionals in public relations, sports information, video, development and alumni affairs throughout the state. News Release: Hires Josh Merrill as New Head Baseball Coach

WILBURTON, Oklahoma — Eastern Oklahoma State College has hired Josh Merrill as its new head baseball coach, bringing a strong track record of success in player development, recruitment and postseason performance to the Mountaineer program.

"We are excited to welcome Coach Merrill to the Eastern Baseball program," said EOSC Athletic Director Kendra Whisenhunt. "His experience and leadership will be a tremendous asset to the team. We look forward to seeing him build on the strong foundation and continue the tradition of success."

Merrill joins the Mountaineers after serving three seasons as the head coach at North Iowa Area Community College. During his time with the Trojans, Merrill led the team to 66 wins and two Region 11 tournament appearances. Under his guidance, 18 players earned ICCAC All-Region honors, with one player, Adam Berghult, earning NJCAA Division II All-American honors in 2023. Additionally, Merrill successfully helped 45 players transfer to four-year programs during his tenure at NIACC.

"I am grateful for the opportunity to continue on the rich history of success that Eastern Oklahoma Baseball has had," Merrill said. "I am very excited to jump in and get to work."

Before leading NIACC, Merrill held assistant coaching positions at the University of Southern Indiana and Neosho County Community College. His coaching responsibilities included recruiting, as well as working with hitters, outfielders, and catchers.

A Wichita, Kansas native, Merrill played collegiately as a right-handed pitcher. He began his playing career at Neosho County Community College, helping the team reach back-to-back NJCAA Division I World Series appearances. He later played at the University of Arkansas-Little Rock and King University, earning a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice in 2015. Merrill also holds a Master of Science in Healthcare Administration from Oklahoma State University, earned in 2019.



Merrill takes over a program that recently returned to the NJCAA Division I World Series for the first time in 24 years, and he aims to continue building upon that momentum.



News Release: EOSC Launches New Degree Program in Native American Studies

WILBURTON, Oklahoma — Eastern Oklahoma State College is expanding its academic offerings with the launch of a new associate degree in Native American Studies, beginning in the upcoming academic year.

The new program will provide students with the opportunity to explore the histories, cultures and contributions of Indigenous peoples of the Americas through a multidisciplinary approach. Courses will be offered across several departments on campus each semester, including history, languages, law and literature.

Designed to broaden students' understanding of the Native American experience, the program places Indigenous perspectives, values and voices at the center of the curriculum. The degree is an excellent foundation for students planning to transfer to a four-year institution to pursue majors such as anthropology, history, legal studies or languages.

"We're proud to offer a program that honors the deep cultural roots of our region while equipping students with knowledge and skills that will serve them in many academic and professional paths," said EOSC President Dr. Randy Harp. "This initiative reflects our commitment to creating meaningful opportunities for all students to grow and succeed."

As part of the new degree plan, Eastern will list courses each semester that count toward the Native American Studies program requirements. These courses will integrate academic disciplines while centering on Indigenous knowledge and traditions, preparing students for careers or further study in fields such as tribal government, cultural resource management, education, social services, community advocacy, and public policy.

The Native American Studies degree will also be available to high school students through concurrent enrollment opportunities, allowing them to begin earning college credit while completing their diploma. In addition, the program will be accessible nationwide, with multiple tribal nations represented across in-person, hybrid and online course formats to accommodate students in a variety of learning environments.

News Release: EOSC awarded \$1.7 million to support first-generation, low-income, and students with disabilities through TRIO Student Support Services

WILBURTON, Oklahoma — The U.S. Department of Education has awarded Eastern Oklahoma State College a federal TRIO Student Support Services grant totaling \$1,742,575 to improve college retention and graduation rates among low-income, first-generation students, and students with disabilities.

This award marks the continuation of more than 30 years of TRIO SSS services on Eastern's campus. Since the 1990s, the program has served thousands of students, helping them stay in school, earn degrees, and build meaningful careers.

Through individualized services including academic tutoring, financial aid, scholarship guidance, career exploration, personal and academic counseling, and mentoring, TRIO SSS empowers students to overcome barriers to success. These comprehensive supports make it significantly more likely that students will complete their degree or successfully transfer, with the lowest possible debt.

"This grant allows Eastern to deepen our commitment to ensuring that all students—regardless of background—can thrive academically and personally," said Colby Carpenter, academic counselor. "Student Support Services helps level the playing field and equips our students with the tools and confidence to graduate and lead."

Nationally, the SSS program has a proven track record. According to a rigorous 2019 evaluation by the U.S. Department of Education, students in SSS at two-year institutions were 48% more likely to earn an associate's degree or transfer to a four-year school, and students at four-year institutions were 18% more likely to earn a bachelor's degree compared to similar peers not in the program.

"TRIO programs generally and TRIO SSS, in particular, transforms students from the least resourced backgrounds into college graduates," said Kimberly Jones, president of the Council for Opportunity in Education



in Washington, D.C. "This vital program makes all the difference for nearly a million students each year across the country."

SSS is one of eight federal TRIO programs funded under the Higher Education Act of 1965 to remove social, academic, and cultural barriers to higher education. Since its inception in 1968, SSS has helped millions of low-income, first-generation students graduate from college and contribute to their communities and the economy. Notable alumni of the TRIO Student Support Services program include Michael Cashman, Town Supervisor of Plattsburgh, NY; former NASA astronaut José Hernández; and Cheryl Johnson, 36th Clerk of the U.S. House of Representatives.

News Release: 57 EOSC Student-Athletes Named to 2024-2025 NJCAA All-Academic Teams

WILBURTON, Oklahoma — Eastern Oklahoma State College student-athletes have once again demonstrated excellence in the classroom as well as on the field. A total of 57 Mountaineer student-athletes earned NJCAA All-Academic honors for the 2024-2025 academic year, with four of Eastern's athletic teams also being named NJCAA Academic Teams of the Year.

To be recognized as an NJCAA Academic Team of the Year, a team must achieve a combined GPA of 3.0 or higher. Eastern's softball team led the way with a 3.75 GPA, ranking No. 10 in the nation. Men's soccer posted a 3.49 GPA (No. 9), baseball earned a 3.41 GPA (No. 46), and men's basketball followed with a 3.10 GPA (No. 50).

"I'm incredibly proud of our student-athletes for maintaining high academic standards while competing at such a high level athletically," said Kendra Whisenhunt, EOSC athletic director and head softball coach. "These rankings reflect our ongoing commitment to student success both in the classroom and in competition."

The NJCAA also recognized individual student-athletes with All-Academic honors. To qualify, students must have completed two full-time semesters and maintained a GPA of 3.60 or higher.




Welcome Weekend is coming up fast!






