

SAT Admission and Course Placement Changes

Below you will find information regarding: 1) who is impacted, 2) what the updated SAT scores are, and 3) when the updated SAT scores take effect.

Admission

Who:

- Impacts regional and community college students, as detailed below

What:

- Regional University Admission (first-time freshmen and concurrent enrollment)
 - Current (Based on the 2016 ACT/SAT Concordance Table): ACT 20 = SAT 1020
 - Updated Score (Based on the 2018 ACT/SAT Concordance Table): ACT 20 = SAT 1030
- Community College Admission (concurrent enrollment)
 - Current (Based on the 2016 ACT/SAT Concordance Table): ACT 19 = SAT 980
 - Updated Score (Based on the 2018 ACT/SAT Concordance Table): ACT 19 = SAT 990

When:

- This will take effect for the 2019-2020 academic year. Therefore, the updated scores will be required for students seeking admission for the Summer 2019 semester and thereafter.

Course Placement

Who:

- Impacts all student categories in all tiers

What:

- Math College Readiness
 - Old Score (Based on College Board's 2016 College Readiness Recommendation): Math SAT = 530
 - Updated Score (Based on the 2018 ACT/SAT Concordance Table): Math SAT = 510
- Reading and English College Readiness
 - Old Score (Based on College Board's 2016 College Readiness Recommendation): Evidence-Based Reading and Writing SAT = 480
 - Updated Score (Based on the 2018 ACT/SAT Concordance Table): Evidence-Based Reading and Writing SAT = 510

When:

- The institutions that reached out to me about ACT/SAT concordance expressed an interest in the course placement standards changing ASAP as opposed to next year. As a result, the course placement standard changes take effect immediately.
