Spring OKAIRP Conference Was a Huge Success

About 40 individuals attended the Oklahoma Association for Institutional Research and Planning (OKAIRP) conference that was held at the University of Science and Arts in Chickasha on April 2, 2004. Keynoting the conference was Dr. Paul Risser, Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. Chancellor Risser spoke on the results of various policies and the impact they have on the state. Mr. Bob Smith of the Smith Consulting Group discussed the topics of ethics and accountability. Dr. Jim Purcell, Executive Director of State System Research for the Oklahoma State Regents of Higher Education, gave an insightful presentation on the role of IR in utilizing information on campuses, using the medieval Merlin as inspiration. The concurrent sessions featured a variety of topics from a student success model, testing systems, consortiums, and online surveys. Pre-conference topics of online factbooks and special features of Excel were very helpful.
