## CAREER WORKSHOP THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 19, 2015



<u>Career Workshop Facilitator: Dr. Elizabeth A. McDaniel</u>, currently a research staff member at the Institute of Defense Analyses in Alexandria, Virginia, contributes her knowledge and perspectives on leadership, personnel, higher education, and organizational issues in government. Prior to her arrival in March 2012, she served as the Dean of Faculty and Academic Programs at iCollege of National Defense University for a dozen years, responsible for the quality of the college's interdisciplinary graduate-level curriculum, academic programs, faculty development, and scholarship related to Information Age government and leadership. Dr. McDaniel began her academic career at the

University of Hartford, where she advanced from assistant to full professor, and from assistant to associate vice president for academic affairs. She was an American Council on Education (ACE) Fellow in the Office of the President at the University of Connecticut in 1989-1990.

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The Career Workshop is a collaborative workshop where participants will explore their visions of higher education and their roles in it — now and into the future. Through dialogue and reflection, participants will expand their perspectives on leaders and leadership, and their career passions, priorities, and possibilities.

**Who should attend?** Anyone looking to determine their "next step" in higher education, whether that be faculty, administrator, or support roles.

When Is it? Thursday, November 19 from 9:00am to 4:00pm at the University of Central Oklahoma.
