Financial Aid Counselor

Job Summary:

- Provide advice and assistance to students and parents regarding applying for financial assistance, including federal aid and institutional scholarships.
- Through in-person contact, phone and email communication, provide information to students regarding their aid application at OSU and assist students and parents in developing a plan of action for completing the application process.
- Provide guidance and information to students regarding maintaining and/or regaining eligibility for assistance.
- Review aid applications to verify accuracy and determine need for additional information.
- Use professional judgment in determining whether student has unusual circumstances that would affect financial aid eligibility.
- Support OSU's recruitment and retention mission through the presentation of financial aid information, both on-campus and throughout the area.

- Bachelor's Degree.
- Minimum of one year experience in a related setting.

Preferred:

- Master's Degree in Counseling, Student Development or Higher Education
- Experience working with students in a collegiate setting.
- Public speaking experience.
- Experience working in an online computer environment or with personal computer applications.
- Experience working with the financial aid process and a background in personal finance.
- Three years of experience related to financial aid counseling.
